Fort Ontario State Historic Site Originally built in 1755 as a British fortress overlooking Lake Ontario, the first Fort Ontario was destroyed by French troops under the command of the Marquis de Montcalm in 1756. Dune Walk – El Dorado Black Pond Part of the Black Pond Wildlife Management Area, this haven for migratory birds includes 1,880 feet of elevated boardwalk winding through wooded bogs, a 2,700 foot trail. Antique Boat Museum Collection of America's premier freshwater boats, located on one of the loveliest harbors in the 1000 Islands.
