
Oswego County and its citizens played important roles in the abolitionist movement during the mid-1800s. Many became involved in the struggle to end slavery through politics or by providing assistance to slaves fleeing the south through the **Underground Railroad**. This extensive network includes 11 sites that have been honored with placement on the National Register of Historic Places (*).


